Overview

FLYRS Fundraising Manager (FM) will lead the organization's fundraising and financial sustainability efforts as FLYRS advances towards a more well-rounded financial model. As a new position in the FLYRS organization, the FM will have the opportunity to build FLYRS financial strength through three main pillars: fundraising, sponsorship, and donor/public relations with FLYRS community partners. This is an administrative position working in harmony with the Executive Director towards advancing the FLYRS mission. The FM will work collaboratively with the Executive Director to continually analyze, develop, and implement strategy for the growing fundraising program.

Responsibilities

The responsibilities of the FM revolve around three main pillars: fundraising, sponsorship, and donor/public relations.

Fundraising

- Oversee, organize, and execute at least three special fundraising events per fiscal year with an appropriate income goal

- Create and execute a strategy to recruit a base of recurring individual donors

Donor/Public Relations

- Assist in the planning and execution of FLYRS community outreach events
- Oversee the creation of fundraising “pitch” materials to include brochures, e-mails, letters, and videos
- Recruit and lead a committee of volunteers to assist with organizational fundraising efforts as necessary

Sponsorship

- Develop and maintain ongoing relationships with sponsors and consistent communications through regular newsletters and updates
- Meet or exceed a sponsorship income goal at the beginning of each fiscal year
- Oversee and ensure sponsorship fulfillment
- Utilize a community partnership and sponsorship structure that clearly details the benefits of various levels of sponsorship and contribution
- Other duties and tasks as may be assigned by the Executive Director to further the FLYRS fundraising program and mission
